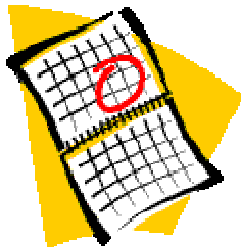

TUTOR TIP




Many of our students express an interest in learning to use computers and e-mail. You may want to help your student set up a free e-mail account by using the computers in the library. Encouraging your student to use e-mail can be a great way for him to work on his literacy skills. Have your student e-mail you a short message in between your tutoring sessions. Writing back and forth to each other through e-mails is similar to keeping a dialog journal. Begin by sending an e-mail to your student and include at least one question. Tell your student that he does not need to worry about having perfect spelling or grammar when he replies to your e-mail, but make sure to model correct spelling, punctuation, and grammar in your e-mails. Writing e-mails can be a fun way for your student to work on his writing skills and will also allow you to keep in touch and learn more about him between tutoring sessions.
